PHI MU DELTA REVOKES UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE CHARTER

CHERRY HILL, NJ – Phi Mu Delta Fraternity announces today that its National Council has voted to revoke the charter of its Nu Beta Chapter at the University of New Hampshire. As such, the chapter is immediately closed for a period of three to five years. The Nu Beta chapter was originally chartered in 1918.

“Phi Mu Delta expects all members and chapters to abide by the Fraternity’s risk management policies and principles,” stated Paul Kittle, National President. “When chapters choose to ignore those policies, they choose to ignore our principles and values. A lack of peer accountability left closure as the only option.”

Phi Mu Delta was founded on March 1, 1918 at the Universities of Connecticut, New Hampshire and Vermont, as the first national fraternity to accept men regardless of their race or religious affiliation. Our mission is to provide a positive fraternity experience for today's college man, encouraging high personal standards, morally, mentally, and spiritually, and, to help its members live the ideals of our founders: democracy, brotherhood and service.
