

Phi Mu Delta Fraternity Accreditation Program 2019

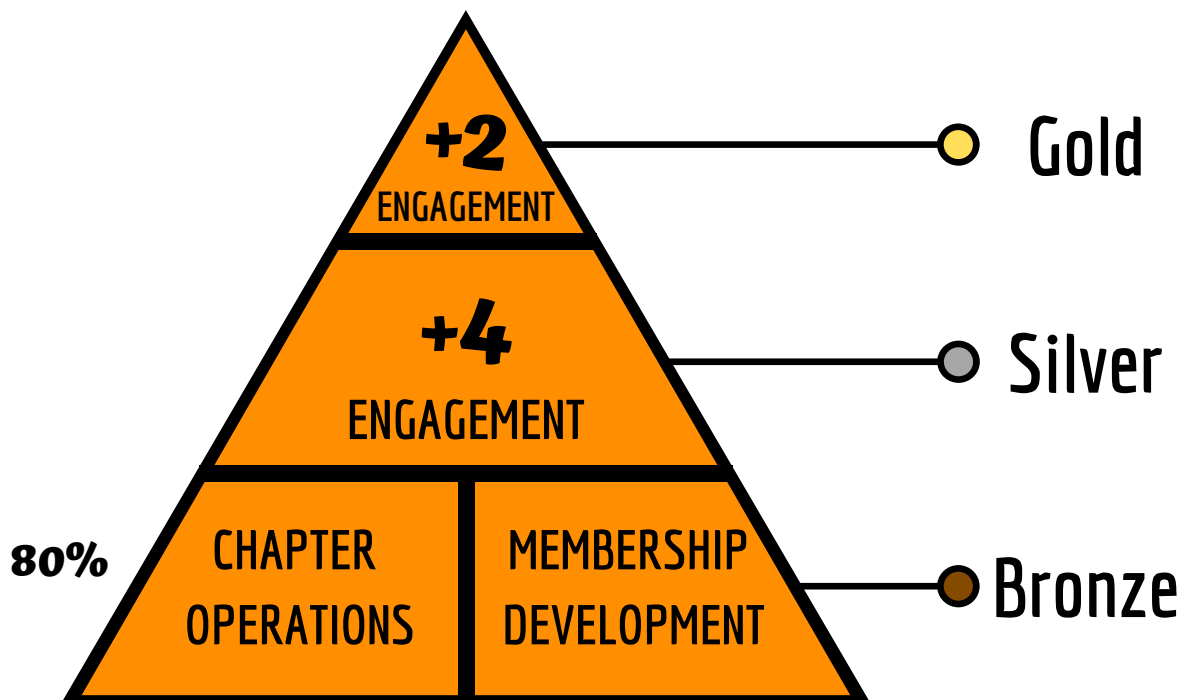
The new Accreditation Program is designed to ensure that chapters and colonies are meeting the minimum expectations for chapter operations and member development while aspiring to achieve greater engagement and positive Fraternal experiences at a local-level. All chapters and colonies are expected to participate in the National Accreditation Program on a semester-basis.

Each chapter/colony is expected to achieve 80% of the 20 total expectations listed under Membership Development & Chapter Operations in order to attain Bronze Accreditation. In order to achieve Silver or Gold, Bronze must be met as well as the chapter/colony executing on at least 4 and 6 Engagement Goals respectively. Chapters/colonies will submit an Engagement Goals Worksheet for each Engagement Goal they intend to accomplish that semester; this will be due Feb. 7 for Spring semester and Sept. 7 for Fall semester. Throughout the semester, the chapter/colony will document progress, small wins, and areas of need as part of the President's Monthly Report, due every 7th of each month that chapter is in session.

Bronze Status: Meet 80% of total expectations in Member Development & Chapter Operations.

Silver Status: Complete Bronze Status. Create, plan, and execute on at least 4 Engagement Goals that apply to the list below.

Gold Status: Complete Bronze Status. Create, plan, and execute on at least 6 Engagement Goals that apply to the list below.

LEADING THE LION PRIDE	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Submission and approval of New Member Education Syllabus. 2. Induction Fees are paid within 48 hours after Induction Ceremony. 3. Initiation Report and Fees are submitted 10 days prior to Initiation Ceremony.
ACADEMICS	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Chapter GPA is above the All-Men's Average GPA. 2. Chapter submits academic plan that outlines support for members at risk and rewards members who achieve.

TOTAL MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Chapter maintains a calendar of brotherhood development programs throughout the semester, including service, academic, social, and personal development opportunities.

CHAPTER LEADERSHIP	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Chapter has submitted and had approved most recent Chapter Constitution and By-Laws. 2. Chapter Officers report is submitted when new officers are elected. 3. Submit Monthly Goals Update.
CONDUCT BOARD	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Chapter has functioning Conduct Board and provide documentation of its implementation.
RITUAL	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Chapter performs initiation ritual each semester witnessed by alumni advisors/National Representative or submit recorded video to the National Office.
ADVISORY BOARD	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Chapter has active Chapter Advisor attending meetings and working with Executive Committee.

RISK MANAGEMENT	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. All chapter members are educated on and understand Phi Mu Delta Risk Management Policies. 2. Chapter has zero risk management violations.
FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Chapter has no debt with the National Fraternity. 2. Chapter submits budgets for each semester on time. 3. All active members are up to date in GreekBill.
RECRUITMENT/RETENTION	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Chapter has submitted recruitment plan with recruitment goals and strategies. 2. Chapter retains 90% or more or new members from Induction.
